### Dear Friends,

It's a few days early, but can I take this opportunity to wish all of you across Burnley & Pendle Circuit a very happy Christmas.

I'm sure that over the festive period many of you will be in church to sing our wonderful Christmas Carols and to hear again the Christmas story recorded in Matthew and Luke. There are Angels bringing messages from God, a baby is born and laid in a manger on soft straw with placid animals looking on. Shepherds visit and then wise men with gifts. It's a very warm and safe image that brings joy to the heart. Just thinking about it brings a warm cosy glow.

Yet the first Christmas wasn't cosy at all. Mary and Joseph had to walk from Nazareth to Bethlehem, a journey of about 90 miles that would have taken them several days to complete. It was a fair distance to walk, especially for a pregnant woman. There is no mention in the Gospels of Mary riding a donkey.

When they arrived in Bethlehem there was no room for them in the family guest room, the best translation of the Greek word sometimes translated as inn; and so they had to make do with the common room where the daily household activities took place, where animals were indeed fed and where there was no privacy. This was where Mary gave birth to her baby, Jesus, the Son of God – or to be more theological, this was God entered into God's own creation, fully human and fully divine.

Our God contracted to a span, incomprehensibly made man, in the poorest of circumstances and born to a poor family.

Then there were Jesus first visitors, shepherds from the nearby fields, invited by angels.

Shepherds were not well thought of in first century Jewish society. They were almost the same category as tax collectors in the eyes of most. Because they spent so long in the fields caring for their sheep they rarely attended Synagogue and they had the reputation of having a casual attitude to other people's property. They were what we might describe as rough men.

#### Tent of Nations stay Sunday 3rd Nov - 16th Nov

My name is Bea Foster, I live in the U.K. For many years, I have been going out to Palestine and staying in the West Bank volunteering with many organisations, who are working for Peace and Justice for all in the Holy Land. My motivation is my Christian Faith, the belief that all are made in the image of God and as such deserves the same rights and should be treated equally and with respect. In November of this year 2024, I travelled to the Tent of Nations, where I stayed for 2 weeks volunteering. The Nassar family have owned the Farm for over 100 years, but have been battling with the courts the last 33 years to prove that the land is theirs. The farm is surrounded by 5 Illegal settlements, volunteers, like myself go there to be a protective present for the family against attacks from the Illegal settlers. Their motto is `We refuse to be enemies`, their Sumud, steadfastness and Resilience in the face of overwhelming injustice is a challenge to us all. Let me add, because we are Internationals, we are in no danger what so ever, I did not have a moment on the farm when I did not feel safe. One meets with many Internationals from many countries who come and volunteer, whilst I was there I met Americans, French, Germans, Dutch. You are never on your own. So, when there, what does one do. First, one is welcomed by the whole family, Daoud, mum Melaha, Sister Amal, brother Daher, who take good care of your every need whilst there. A big thank you to them all. Daoud Nassar ensures that the jobs you do match your physical ability, as such (I am 75 years of age), I did lots of light jobs, such as Planting, preparing herbs, feeding the animals, stripping of beds and the washing, helping with meals, cleaning, etc. The variety of jobs is vast. Working on the land, being part of things growing all around you, feeds your soul spiritually and you feel a part of God's creation, and begin to understand how, for the Palestinians, the land is part of them. The Olive trees swaying in the wind laden down with olives is a beautiful sight, one I will carry with me always. Picking them was pure joy. As you can tell, for me being there, I feel close to God, his arms around me. To sum up, your time there is full of Fellowship, Friendship, Fun, Faith and wonderful food. The icing on the cake, so to speak is the encouragement your presence is giving to the Nassar family, in their struggle for Justice. One is truly humbled and overwhelmed. I invite you to go, see and you, like me I know with certainty, will come away blessed enormously from the experience. 


Join us for 'Carols through the Years' Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup> Dec at 3pm
